Home Grown Flowers & Plants in a vase.

THE HENDERSON TROPHY Awarded to most points accumulated in classes 1-8

- Class 1 Rose, single HT.
- Class 2 Roses floribunda 3 sprays.
- Class 3 Annuals 5 stems can be mixed variety.
- Class 4 Sweet peas 5 stems can be mixed colour.
- Class 5 Pinks 5 stems.
- Class 6 Perennials, Herbaceous 3stems 1 variety.
- Class 7 Summer flowering bulb single stem.
- **Class 8 Shrub flowering 3 stems from 1 plant.**
- . Entries must be home grown.
- . Where possible avoid using stems with dead heads.
- . Try to avoid using damaged or blemished flowers.
- . Sweet peas judged on straight stems and max flowers.

Classes 9-27

Home Grown Produce THE IXWORTH GARDEN CLUB TROPHY Awarded to most points accumulated in classes 9-27

- **Class 9 Potatoes, 5 same variety and size.**
- Class 10 Carrots, 5 same variety and foliage trimmed to 5 inches and tied.
- Class 12 peas, 5 pods same variety and size.
- Class 13 french beans, 5 same variety and size.
- Class 14 runner beans, 5 same variety and size.
- Class 15 cabbage, 1 single head.
- Class 16 onions, 3 grown from sets, pulled from garden and tied in a bunch.
- Class 17 shallots, 5 tops tied over and set in sand on plate.
- **Class 18 courgettes 3 displayed with or without flowers.**
- Class 19 3 of any other vegetable not listed.
- Class 20 tomatoes on vine same size and variety.
- Class 21 lettuce 1, head.
- Class 22 Beetroot, 3 tops cut to 5 inches and tied.
- **Class 23 Cucumbers 3 same variety and size.**
- **Class 24 Strawberries 5 on a plate with stalks.**
- **Class 25 Raspberries 10 on a plate with stalks.**
- Class 26 5 of any other fruit not listed.
- Class 27 Eggs, 6 in a box same variety and colour. Home produced only so know your hen.

- . All produce in classes 9-27 to be home grown.
- . Any variety may be grown unless otherwise stated.
- . Produce should be displayed on table unless stated that a plate or other vessel should be used.
- . Where produce is grouped, size and shape to be as uniform as possible and skins should be unblemished.
- . Judges will be looking for uniformity, colour and freshness.
- . All exhibits may be cut into during the judging.
- . Peas and beans are sometimes tasted for freshness and should be straight and identical in size and have some stalk attached.
- . Foliage should not be incorporated into the display unless stated.
- . With fruit it is all about size, the bigger the better but it must not have gone over.
- . Eggs are judged using 5 different categories.
- . Presentation, including even colour.
- . Shell quality.
- . Even egg size.
- . Quality of yolk.
- . Quality of albumen, which should be firm.
- . An egg will be broken to hit this criteria.

Remember it is all about having fun.
